NOTICE and REQUEST FOR RULING

NOW COMES Ty Clevenger, the Respondent, and gives notice as follows:

On February 5, 2016, the Respondent sent electronic copies of a Motion to Dismiss, Motion to Permit Discovery, Motion to Transfer, and Request for Hearing to Brigette Tenor, the clerk of the Committee on Grievances. The Respondent also sent hard copies by priority mail, and those copies were received on February 8, 2016. The Committee never filed a response to those motions, therefore the Court may treat the motions as conceded:

Within 14 days of the date of service or at such other time as the Court may direct, an opposing party shall serve and file a memorandum of points and authorities in opposition to the motion. If such a memorandum is not filed within the prescribed time, the Court may treat the motion as conceded.

LcvR 7(b). The Respondent no longer practices in the District of Columbia federal courts, and he wishes to resign from the bar of this Court, but he does not wish to resign while a disciplinary matter is pending. The Respondent therefore asks the Court to grant his motion to dismiss the Charge filed by the Committee. Alternatively, the Respondent asks the Court to dismiss the Charge for want of prosecution.


