Mr. Clevenger,

I read your recent blog post where you cited an excerpt from an internal investigation where my name prominently listed, and made to look as if I was involved with this bar owner in some way. In January of this year I was employed by the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission as a Sergeant in the Enforcement Division. My record with the TABC had been spotless and was well respected within the law enforcement community and my agency, (or so I thought). My area of supervision included the Harker Heights area but my office and primary duty station was in Waco. I suddenly found myself the subject of an internal investigation and being accused of a multitude of frivolous allegations made against me, to include some nefarious connection to this bar owner who was said to be on a "Terrorist Watch List".

I had only met this person once or twice during the 2 years I was the supervisor for the area, and the investigation concluded that not only did I have no connection to this person, when he was interviewed and shown my photo he could not identify me. Needless to say the agency needed a scapegoat in order sustain their investigation and I was terminated based on a catch all policy where they used my wife's former employment with Walmart, and my not publicly disclosing that my brother-in-law (whom I have no affiliation to other than through my wife) was arrested at the Twin Peaks Shootout. (Which occurred while I was a Supervisor in the Arlington Office). Documentation can be produced which will confirm this if necessary.

I would request that you edit your post to reflect that I was in no way involved with Mr. Altrach and I will be sending a more formal request to the TABC General Counsel to have my name removed from unsustained allegations future FOIA documents released by the agency
