Hey Ty,

Based on your briefing in response to my motion to stay, I've asked FBI to propose a more definite schedule than a stay of 3 months, with an emphasis on any report regarding Seth Rich's personal computer. This is our proposal:

1. Report regarding the contents or the analysis of Seth Rich's personal laptop:
  - a. We have a 302 (interview form) stating that the laptop was given to us, but thus far have located no report of it being analyzed by the FBI.
2. We propose to process the 302 as a priority item in the first release, along with the other processing.
  - i. We propose a processing schedule wherein we review approximately 250 pages per month and release the responsive nonexempt portions thereof.
  - ii. We propose the first release on or about April 1.
  - iii. The 250 page-per-month would last until there is an impactful change in RIDS staffing levels.
    1. Once RIDS staffing levels have returned to normal, we anticipate processing approximately 500 ppm on the same basis.
    2. Vice versa, if RIDS staffing levels are reduced further or RIDS must completely shut down, it would affect our ability to process.
  - iv. We also propose to provide the Court with an update on the page count at the same time as the first production, April 1.
